
The Swiss Second Helvetic Confession (1566) is one of the most widely accepted confessional statements among Reformed Christians throughout the world.

Tithes and offerings may be left in the offering plate. Those who prefer to donate electronically are invited to donate through our church website:




Our congregation has a practice of staying seated for the duration of the postlude.

Come to the Table of Grace




- 2 Come to the table of peace...


