

Affirmation of Faith | From the Confession of 1967

The church responds to the message of reconciliation in praise and prayer. Our worship does not end with the postlude, but continues out into the world, where we are sent to love and care for God's people.


### Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah 65




## O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing
