

The Confession of 1967 was influenced by Karl Barth, reflecting the view of Scripture espoused by the corresponding biblical theology movement prominent in mainline Protestant theological schools in the midtwentieth century.

For communion, ushers will invite the back row on the Sappington side first. When all on that side have come forward, ushers will continue on the courtyard side, starting with the back row again. It is our practice to take the elements back to our seats, and eat and drink together after all have been served. If you are unable to come forward, the elements will be brought to you where you are seated.

Our congregation has a practice of staying seated for the duration of the postlude.

Our worship does not end with the postlude, but continues out into the world, where we are sent to love and care for God's people.


Our featured image today is a painting by Eugene Ruble.


Glory to God, Whose Goodness Shines on Me
