Grace and Peace to you!

One of the deepest joys of ministry is getting to know each of you. To know how you are doing. Really actually doing. How God is showing up in your life, or how you are searching for God's presence. It is always an honor to be invited into your lives, in whatever capacity, to experience the good and the bad together as a community of faith.

Throughout the season of Lent, we are using blessings from Kate Bowler's "Bless the Lent we <u>Actually</u> Have" to shape our worship at our Liturgical Arts. What I like most about her writings and these blessings, in particular, is they invite God's presence into our lives as they are. We don't need to keep God at a distance until we have it all together (whatever that might look like) but can ask God to bless our <u>actual</u> lives, not our idealized ones.

On Ash Wednesday we did this together. In Ashes-to-Go in the morning in front of our church, at Teleo Coffee in the afternoon, and at our Ash Wednesday Worship service, each person was blessed with the right sizing blessing to "remember that we are dust and to dust we will return." I preached about how this right-sizes us in the universe as it reminds us that we are cared for and created by our Creator God who loves us, while at the very same time, we are part of the fabric of the universe.

Our <u>actual</u> lives in this particular moment in the life of the church have been several members dealing with hip replacements, a few experiencing illnesses and isolation. and all of us continuing to hope and love and care in a world where there is still pandemic and war. Our <u>actual</u> lives include navigating the challenges of aging for both ourselves and our parents. We've been seeking to be a friend to our classmates and to navigate our own emotions in a changing world. We've tried to speak up when we can and to love those we might not always like. We've been choosing over and over again to worship God, to confess our sins, and to try to preach the Gospel.

In the minutia of our day-to-day life it might not seem like anything extraordinary is happening, but that's sort of the point. When we zoom out, naming the good and the bad in these <u>actual</u> lives we're living helps us to notice the actual lives of everyone else around us, and the way all of it adds up into something so very worthy of blessing.

As Kate Bowler writes, "Lent is a time to remember that we are not alone on this journey, that we are part of a

larger community of faith, and that we have the support and encouragement of our fellow travelers. As we reflect on our own mortality and our need for God's grace, we are reminded that we are part of a long line of faithful people who have gone before us. Together, we can support one another, sharing our joys and our sorrows, and reminding one another of the hope that sustains us along the way."

What a gift it is, to be living our <u>actual</u> lives together with each of you.


