I'll Praise My Maker

Psalm 146 begins the final set of five psalms in the book of Psalms. In Hebrew they each begin with "Hallelujah," which the KJV renders as "Praise the Lord." This psalm is properly understood as psalm of praise rather than a psalm of thanksgiving because it celebrates God' nature rather than some personal benefit received from God. Psalm 146 describes a much more intimate deity engaged in causes of justice, in healing, and in protecting the faithful. When carefully considered, it is not hard to understand why this hymn was one of John Wesley's favorites or why he is said to have died with it on his lips.
