A spoken hope from the silence of heaven.

May we gather round that which enlivens our longing that breathes into incarnation and sets free the word of life; in this season, for this time, in our "now."

+Candle Lighting Liturgy

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee O Israel. O Come, thou Wisdom from on high, who orderest all things mightily: to us the path of knowledge show; And teach us in her ways to go. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to the O Israel.

Reader One: Every journey faces the unknown. And anxiety can sometimes overwhelm us. There is too much to do; our lists are long; our calendars are filled up; we worry that something will go wrong, or we won't end up in the right place or take the right route. Getting lost is a real possibility on a journey. And yet. We claim hope for the journey, because we follow the one who will travel with us and sustain us on the way.

Reader Two: Isaiah says that there is one who is to come who will be the fulfillment of all our hope. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on this one, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. We place our hope in this one.

Reader One: We light the candles of peace and of hope to give us strength for the journey.

(Light two candles on the wreath.)

Reader Two: Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, that God may teach us the ways of peace and hope.

O come, O come, thou Root of Jesse, free thine own from Satan's tyranny; from depths of hell they people save and give them victory o'er the grave. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to the O Israel.

Unison Prayer of Confession

Repent for the kingdom of heaven has come near. Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Let us come before the Lord confessing our sins and crooked paths.

Loving God, we have no idea how a wolf could live with a lamb. Why wouldn't a kid fear a leopard? The calf and the lion and the fatling together sound crazy, but a little child shall lead them – and us? We confess our exasperation with with such seemingly naïve words. And yet Lord, we know them to be true. We do not bear fruit worthy of repentance. We do not welcome one another as you welcome us. We have not lived into your hopes and dreams for us. We have not spread your peace. We are too often the wolf, the leopard and the lion. Help us learn to follow the little child and love the kid, calf and fatling. Help us live into your love and peace and promise for us. Forgive us, we pray.

Silence is kept.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." We have been baptized with the waters of repentance, and God never gives up on us - on you. Know that in the name of Jesus Christ your sins are forgiven. Now go and sin no more.

Isaiah 11: 1-10

- A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
- 2 The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.
- 3 His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.
- He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear;
- 4 but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth;
- he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

Gospel

Matthew 3:1-12

1 In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, 2 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." 3 This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.' " 4 Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. 5 Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, 6 and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. 7 But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Bear fruit worthy of repentance. 9 Do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. 10 Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. 11 "I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 12 His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."
